In a storm-hardened fortress on the flank of a mountainside in the northern Sierra Nevada, the British built the sixth largest gold mine in California, the Plumas Eureka.

Painstakingly researched in the business papers of the mine and richly illustrated with photographs made on glass-plate negatives by the mine's employees, *Plumas Eureka on Glass* takes its name both from nineteenth-century photography and from the brittle and dark window through which we must view the history of the mine over a hundred years later.

The hour-long presentation will feature many rare photos as well as the story behind researching and writing this fascinating work. Questions during the presentation are encouraged. Books will be available at the event.
